



Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction

"Promote the resilience of new and existing critical infrastructure, including water, transportation and telecommunications infrastructure, educational facilities, hospitals and other health facilities, to ensure that they remain safe, effective and operational during and after disasters in order to provide live-saving and essential services."


Objectives of Campus Safety Program






Risk Assessment

Disaster preparedness mechanism/capacity




The following awareness activities have been initiated:

- Disaster response manuals









Campus Safety Survey – The Good, The Bad, The Ugly

- Mechanism in place to establish a counter-measure office and have developed a response manual and plan.
- Physical structure areas, such as disaster-resistant structures, emergency communication, and emergency stockpiles, have been progressed.
- + Support toward **psychosocial aspects** has been provided after disasters.

- The area of **risk assessment** requires more attention and effort.
- Conducting simulation
 exercise of
 preparedness/response
 plan is required.
- Early warning and alert systems have not been installed widely.
- Further support and consideration for foreign students is required.
