Overview of the results of the 3rd UN WCDRR 1)

- Held in Sendai City from Saturday, March 14 to Wednesday, March 18, 2015.
- The main conference was attended by 6,593 people, including representatives from 185 UN member states (over 100 cabinet members, including 25 prime ministers), international organizations, NGOs, and the media.
- The Public Forum was attended by a total of 150,000 participants from both home and abroad.
- The largest-ever UN-related international conference held in Japan.

1 Main conference

The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030, which is an international guiding principle for DRR for the next 15 years, and the Sendai Declaration, which contains the political commitments of each country to DRR, were formulated and adopted.

2 Public Forum

The Great East Japan Earthquake Forum, the programs "Civil Society Collaboration and DRR" and "Gender and DRR" in the Thematic Pavilions, and symposiums hosted by ministries and agencies, universities, NGOs, and community groups were held at several venues in the city. Various indoor and outdoor exhibitions were also held, including the International Exhibition on Disaster Risk Reduction and the Tohoku Reconstruction & DRR Pavilion.

3 Welcome events

Study tours, excursions, and receptions hosted by community organizations were conducted in cooperation with the prefectures in the Tohoku region.


Major disasters in the world (since 2000)











Rash of natural disasters and their impact on sustainable development

Materials provided by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs

- 90% of the victims of natural disasters = residents in developing countries The most vulnerable are exposed to natural disasters. (human security)
- Serious economic losses
 - ex.) Haiti Earthquake (2010): Damage (7.8 billion dollars) = 1.2 times of GDP
 - The earthquake ruined the efforts and results of long-term development in a moment.

- DRR is essential to protect human lives and development results and realize sustainable development.
- Prior investment for DRR based on a long-term perspective before the occurrence of disasters is smaller compared to recovery costs after the disasters. (Investment for DRR is rewarding.)
 - Aiming to mainstream DRR, introducing the perspective of DRR into every development plan and policy

Sendai was recognized as a Role Model in the 2010-2015 World Disaster Campaign "Making Cities Resilient."

We have a duty to contribute to worldwide DRR.

(A role model in promoting community-based DRR and empowering people to act on DRR.)

Why Sendai?

Sendai is well regarded as having proactively been prepared for earthquakes by reinforcing buildings prior to the 2011 earthquake. Since the disasters, the city and its citizens have worked together to take resilience and environmental measure to the next level based on the lessons learned from the Great East Japan Earthquake.





Margareta Wahlstrom, Special representative of the UN Secretary-General for Disaster Risk Reduction presented the Mayor of Sendai with a certificate of recognition on October 9th, 2012.

As a role model city

Sendai will share its ongoing DRR initiatives with the world and help to develop a worldwide culture of disaster prevention together with the United Nations, based on the lessons learned from the Great East Japan Earthquake.

Taking the opportunity of this conference, we wanted to build the future of the city.

Develop Sendai as a city with advanced disaster management policies

- Encouraged residents, companies, and various other organizations to participate in the conference to prevent the memories of the earthquake from fading away and raise awareness of DRR



5. Results and evaluation of the conference

Evaluation of the conference 1)

It was the largest-ever UN-related international conference held in Japan (largest-ever in terms of the participating countries).

The conference obtained political commitments from the international community to DRR, which is a significant achievement to mainstream DRR.



Evaluation of the conference 2)

In the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030, which is a new international guiding principle for DRR, ideas suggested by Japan, such as the importance of investment in DRR, commitment by various stakeholders, and the concept of "Build Back Better," were included.



Evaluation of the conference 3)

Sendai Cooperation Initiative for Disaster Risk Reduction

1 Basic Concept

- Disasters are an obstacle to poverty eradication and sustainable development, and thus a threat to human security.
- Mainstreaming of disaster risk reduction (DRR) introducing the DRR perspective in all development policy and planning is important.
 Clearly positioning DRR in the post-2015 development agenda is important from the perspective of resource mobilization.
- High attention to the efforts for "adaptation" at the climate change negotiation where an agreement is required by the end of this year. Firm DRR efforts will contribute to the climate change negotiation.
- Japan will build with the international community a society that is resilient to disasters by sharing with the world its knowledge and technology as a country advanced in DRR.

2 Basic Policies

- Japan attaches particular importance to the three points in DRR policies outlined below, building on the experience of the past 10 years since the formulation of HFA.
 - (1) Investment in DRR from the long-term perspective

Prior investment in DRR is more cost-effective than post-disaster emergency response and recovery and contributes to sustainable development.

(2) Build Back Better

The post-disaster phase provides an opportunity to implement drastic measures to build countries and regions that are resilient to disasters.

- (3) Collaboration between the central governments and various actors
 - Addressing with networks including local governments, private companies, NGOs/CSOs, international organizations and regional organizations, with the central government taking the initiative.
- Japan will take the following perspectives into consideration in implementing cooperation.
 - (1) The human security approach and promoting women's participation (women, children, the elderly and persons with disabilities)
 - (2) Cooperation based on the perspective of adaptation to the impacts of climate change
 - (3) Utilizing Japan's knowledge and technology



Cooperation through effectively combining (i) non-material assistance, (ii) material assistance and (iii) global and region-wide cooperation.

Evaluation of the conference 4)

- Since the conference was held in Sendai City, one of the areas affected by the Great East Japan Earthquake, the conference provided an opportunity to spread the reconstruction from the Great East Japan Earthquake with cooperation from the surrounding local governments.
- •Food and liquors produced in the disaster-affected areas were actively provided at the receptions hosted by the Government of Japan and Sendai City to counter harmful rumors.
- It became possible to transmit the current condition and reconstruction of the disaster-affected areas through study tours.






- The Public Forum was attended by a total of 150,000 people, which greatly exceeded expectations.
- The reconstruction of disaster-affected areas in Sendai City and the Tohoku region was transmitted through the Public Forum and study tours.
- The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030, and the Sendai Declaration, with the name of "Sendai" were adopted.
- A network with international institutions was established.
- The success of the conference serves as a stepping stone for Sendai to become a convention city.



Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030



- 1. We, the Heads of State and Government, ministers and delegates participating in the Third United Nations World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction, have gathered from 14 to 18 March 2015 in Sendai City of Miyagi Prefecture in Japan, which has demonstrated a vibrant recovery from the Great East Japan Earthquake in March 2011. Recognizing the increasing impact of disasters and their complexity in many parts of the world, we declare our determination to enhance our efforts to strengthen disaster risk reduction to reduce disaster losses of lives and assets worldwide.
- 2. We value the important role played by the Hyogo Framework for Action 2005-2015: Building the Resilience of Nations and Communities to Disasters during the past ten years. Having completed the assessment and review of and considered the experience gained under its implementation, hereby adopt the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030. We are strongly committed to the implementation of the new framework as the guide to enhance our efforts for the future.
- We call all stakeholders to action, aware that the realization of the new framework depends on our unceasing and tireless collective efforts to make the world safer from the

- A variety of information on DRR and management, and on reconstruction of affected areas, was transmitted at the popular level. This was highly appreciated by participants. It also increased the self-belief of individual residents and enhanced their willingness to continue DRR efforts.
- Two outcome documents, "Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030" and "Sendai Declaration," were adopted. This was a great honor for the city, and at the same time, we took on the responsibility to further enhance our efforts in the future.
- We will work to build a more resilient city than ever to realize the concept of "Build Back Better," aiming to set an example to the world as the host city of the conference and a role model city in the UN World Disaster Reduction Campaign.
- We will pass on efforts for DRR and management to the next generation, and continue to transmit information on our efforts to the world, making use of domestic and international networks formed through the holding of the conference.

Future of Sendai as a disaster-resistant city



As the host city of the conference, we will incorporate the results of the conference, which are reflected in the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction, into various administrative areas of the city.



We will promote our efforts, in cooperation with residents and organizations that demonstrated their willingness to actively participate in our efforts in the Public Forum, and transmit information on our activities.



To continue to transmit information on disaster prevention efforts from Sendai, we will pay attention to discussion about DRR at home and abroad after the conference. We will also hold various events, such as symposiums, in cooperation with the UN and relevant organizations.



We will identify the issues on how to host conferences through questionnaire and hearing surveys and use the survey results in hosting future conventions, and compile a complete report on the conference by the autumn of this year.
